Dear Student Assembly,

Please find the enclosed copy of the Senior Week By Line Funding Request. Please accept this document as our request to increase our current funding allotment from \$4.50 to \$5.00 per student. The main text should include all the information you have requested.

Senior Week is one of the most looked forward to series of events for cornellians. Our mission is to provide community/class building events that are safe, fun and engaging, allowing for seniors to enjoy Cornell, Ithaca and New York during their last few days on the hill. A sense of unity and pride shall be fostered through a series of events and programming designed to appeal to the diverse nature of our campus community.

Our rationale for an allocation increase stems from the constraints the current allocation imposes on the magnitude of the events we plan. Currently, Senior Week offers a wide variety of events in order to attract a diverse group of students to our events who have a broad range of interests. However, this diversification results in a limited amount of funding allocated towards each event. The proposed increase in funding will allow Senior Week to hold much larger and more entertaining on campus events for the student body.

For example, Comedy Night is traditionally held in the Cinema. Because of the limited funding we are forced to allocate to this event, we cannot bring in notable comedians, nor can we afford to use a larger venue. This tends to result in lackluster attendance at an otherwise worthwhile event. However, in this instance, an increase in funding will allow us to utilize a larger facility (such as Bailey Hall), while bringing in big ticket comedians. Overall, both attendance and the level of satisfaction at our events will skyrocket. This rationale holds for most of our large events, including the Rave, Casino Night, the BBQ, and the Carinval.

### Organizational Biography, History, Officers, Members, Activities/Programming/Events

The first senior class council was established 143 years ago with Cornell's first graduating class. They were charged with doing senior week events and promoting our newest alumni. Ever since then a dedicated group of seniors worked tirelessly to promote Cornell and provide a celebration at the end of the senior year for graduates to enjoy. It is the mission of senior week to provide graduating seniors with enriching activities almost around the clock for week prior to commencement weekend to celebrate their accomplishments at Cornell.

The leadership of the Senior Week Committee are co-chairs who apply in the Spring semester of their junior year. Depending on the year there can be 2-4 co-chairs for senior week. The committee is selected from applicants in the fall semester of their Senior year. Depending on the year the committee size has ranged from 25-45 members.

This year we had 1989 unique purchasers for senior week ticketed events. Many of those students purchased several tickets for multiple events. About 800 students engage in ticketed events each day, Sunday-Thursday of senior week. Our biggest day was Tuesday with 1720 tickets sold.

Our late night free events typically get the following attendance numbers: Carnival 3000-4000 people (not all seniors) Rave 1000+ people (Max out room capacity) Comedy Night 350 (Max out room capacity) Midnight Breakfast 700-800 Movies on the Slope 550-1000 people (We don't do this event every year) BBQ 1200 (we scan id cards and only let graduating seniors participate Casino night 1000+ (Max out room capacity)
