

APPROPRIATIONS REPORT

The Appropriations Committee greatly appreciated the immense amount of work the Executive Board of Class Councils has done to restructure and orient their organization for the future. The Committee hopes to continue to see impact-driven decision-making within the organization and believes structuring the organization around large, well-attended events should continue to be the model. The Committee was concerned, however, that this progress could potentially be lost within boards in the future and hopes Class Councils considers codifying a number of these changes within the Constitution or other internal documentation. They also believe that Class Councils should investigate ways to separate attendance by years to better understand which events are the most successful for every class. The Committee also felt that more could be done to ensure co-sponsorships were determined holistically with metrics associated with the decision-making process. Finally, the members of the Appropriations Committee suggested investigating spending caps within each class year to supplement the current model of spending within the board.
